

Position Announcement- Design Studio Instructor Pool

The University of Kansas School of Architecture and Urban Design invites qualified scholars and professionals to submit applications which will be reviewed by the faculty and placed in a pool for consideration for part-time, teaching positions in studio design. Positions will be filled as needed.

Appointment to the Design Pool is valid for three years from the date of appointment, is renewable and does not automatically result in a teaching appointment.

The University of Kansas is a "Research 1" university located twenty minutes east of Topeka and forty minutes west of Kansas City on a metropolitan corridor along Interstate 70. Kansas City International Airport is an hour away by automobile. The University first held classes in 1866 and has grown to over 28,000 students and 1,000 faculty. The scenic campus is located on Mt. Oread in the center of historic Lawrence, Kansas. Lawrence was founded along the Oregon Trail in 1854 by the New England Emigrant Aid Company in order that Kansas be admitted to the Union as a free state. Lawrence now has a population over 80,000 and maintains historical integrity, independent spirit, and charm. Required Qualifications: Professional degree in architecture and evidence of a minimum three years post-graduation architectural experience in an architectural practice.

Preferred Qualifications: Post-professional degree, professional architectural registration, evidence of design through peer review, publication, or design awards.

Curriculum vitae/resume and a portfolio of professional work for which they were the project architect

Portfolio of student work (if available); and

Deadline Dates: Applications are reviewed twice per year (April 15 for Fall appointments; November 1 for Spring appointments).
